1) Quu'asa

- a) Quu'asa uses traditional cultural and spiritual practices to support and promote mental and emotional healing for former Residential School survivors and their families.

2) Manager of Business Operations

Noah

a) Toquaht Developments

- i) Mill site cleanup of debris and unusable timber.
- ii) 200m3 in stock from TE15. Majority red cedar for community projects.
- iii) Lumber delivered to Ucluelet to renovate Toquaht Office.

b) Toquaht Industries

- i) Currently active with lessee, the Sans Group. Sort will be actively processing 30,000m3.
 Additional timber may arrive in the new year.
- ii) Seeking additional users for 2020. Consulted with Stone Croft engineering to provide options on land and water use and survey work was done to scope out how the site can be expanded in the future.

c) Toquaht Forestry

i) Not active in 2019 due to poor markets and high stumpage. TFLP has many cut blocks ready to advertise but will not harvest until rates level out. TFLP has approximately 25000 m3 which may be harvested in 2020 if markets turn around. ii) Engineering and some tree planting have occurred in 2019 and will continue to plan for upcoming Forest Stewardship Plan in 2021. Inventory of forest license continues and looking at ways to enhance our forest productivity by working with other users in the area.

d) Toquaht Marina and Campground

- i) Marketing the campground has started for 2020 (Times Colonist, Back road map books, chamber of commerce, and Indigenous coast BC grant) Zen Seekers.
- ii) New reservation system and web site program almost complete. Will be active Jan 2020. 'Lets Camp" Program will allow customers to book online with a visual booking system for campsites, marina, parking and launching.
- iii) New gates installed at Marina and Campground for the shoulder seasons
- iv) Putting together a Trail System proposal to expand our visitor experience at the campground. The proposal includes maps and trail options for different user groups of all ages and abilities, a pump track in the campground and options to create trails connecting surrounding communities and businesses.
 - (1) This will require discussions and approvals from appropriate organizations.

e) Barkley Sounds Shellfish

- i) Regular maintenance of sites ongoing with floatation and inspections bi-weekly.
- ii) New vessel, Focal Raider, is now home at Toquaht Marina and Campground.
 - (1) 46ft landing craft capable of 15,000lbs of cargo. The vessel will increase harvestability. Can now set anchors, pack additional payloads, and open doors to additional work within Barkley Sound.
- iii) Researching other species and markets to farm, such as kelp products. Site testing will need to occur to determine if feasible

- i) Public Works Technicians have been working hard and doing a great job operating the Water and Wastewater Treatment systems, and providing other services to Macoah residents like garbage and recycling pick up
- ii) Wastewater Operator training in Chilliwack

- iv) Crew will be working around septic tanks in coming months
