- i) We are improving access to traditional foods by increasing our domestic harvest
- ii) Herd of Elk- Åuunim -was translocated from Lake Cowichan area and transferred into Toquaht territory. This small population will eventually grow large enough to support a sustainable hunt and contribute to access to traditional foods.
 - (1) Toquaht Nation and Ucluelet First Nation are working together to monitor and steward the elk population
- iii) Guardian Program- Two new positions will participate in lands and ocean patrols, data collection, surveys such as oyster, clam, deer, elk. Food fish delivery, GIS mapping and many other tasks.

- **b)** Barkley Sound Shellfish clam, oyster, scallop and kelp stocks have been happily growing
- c) Toquaht Forestry has been busy with engineering work for the next cut block period, logged sites have been re-planted with seedlings and salvage operations occurred
- **d)** The Dryland Sort has been kept active over the past year with some maintenance on the water site as well
- e) The Sawmill site has some new and some upgraded equipment and we are seeking a more suitable location to operate at. Most of the lumber it produces is used in projects at Macoah and Secret Beach
