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## Message From čaamaťa Kevin Mack

#### Hello ťuuqwa?ath,

I would like to thank all who attended the Peoples' Assembly on March 25 2023, via Zoom. The Toquaht Council appreciates you taking the time to listen and engage with the presentations on the draft annual budget, which was prepared with the assistance of our directors and managers.

In February, the draft budget was introduced to Council as a schedule to the Toquaht Nation Annual Budget Act 2023-2024. To approve the budget and make it Toquaht law, Council must have three readings of the draft. First reading is the introduction, second reading is for detailed review, and third reading is for the enactment of the law.

As part of second reading, Council sent the draft budget to the Standing Committee on Finance.

Following the very detailed line-by-line review, the Finance Committee recommended that the draft Toquaht Annual Budget Act for 2023-24 be approved with minor amendments. Council then accepted the recommendation from the Finance Committee and sent the draft to you, at the Peoples' Assembly. The input of the masčim at the Peoples' Assembly on March 25th was an integral part of Council's accountability to you, masčim. Following an overview of funding sources, expenditures, planned programs and services, stewardship activities, capital projects and more, the Peoples' Assembly moved to recommend to Council that the budget be approved.

Council takes great pride to inform you that the draft Toquaht Annual Budget Act 2023-24 went through third reading and was approved by Council on March 29th. The new budget took effect on April 1, 2023 and will guide administrative activities over this fiscal year.

We look forward to updating you on our exciting initiatives at the tuuqwa?athiic hišimyiłyak in Macoah for an in-person Peoples' Assembly on Saturday, June 24, 2023. We have begun planning extra activities so that we can spend some time together enjoying our haahuułi. Hope to see many of you then.



**Scholarships** in the amount of \$5000 are available to full-time students in degree, diploma, certificate, or technical/trades programs connected to BC Hydro careers.

**Bursaries** in the amount of \$2000 are available to part-time students in degree, diploma, certificate, or technical/trades programs connected to BC Hydro careers.

The Randy Brant Memorial Award in the amount of \$8000 will be awarded to the top overall applicant from all bursary and scholarship submissions.

## Toquaht Annual Budget 2023/2024

#### Overview

Finance portfolio holder Kevin Mack introduced the Toquaht Annual Budget for 2023/2024, alongside Robyn Rea, Director of Finance.

## The total budget for the 2023-2024 fiscal year is \$21,410,144.

The budget's sources include previous years' surplus, deferred revenue and new funding sources, including the Fiscal Financing Agreement (Canada), the province of BC, NTC and some of our own revenues.

This total was broken down into budget allocated per department, and each department gave an overview of the activities and projects that would be funded by the budget. All department projects to be funded are developed to be in line with the overall strategic plan.

The motion to approve the Toquaht Annual Budget Act 2023/2024 was passed during the Spring 2023 Toquaht People's Assembly.


#### **Community Services**

#### The total budget allocation for the Community Service Department for the 2023/2024 fiscal year is \$1,474,634.

Specific projects for citizens and health services include addictions recovery for citizens, healthy community activities to promote wellness, monthly doctor, dietician, and physiotherapist visits in Macoah, and increased services in Macoah to include alternative health and traditional healing.

There is also specific funding for Elders, which will go towards the Minor Home Repair and Safety Grant, the Elders Support Grant, and the pre-registration of 5 spots for the annual Elders Conference.

Additional projects funded by the budget include Macoah Emergency Team training, food security programs (community garden, harvesting and processing traditional foods, a make-and-take soup kitchen), and community healthy activities such as fitness and recreation, movie nights, and youth nights.



## Toquaht Annual Budget 2023/2024

#### **Community Services**

The budget will further fund the child and family wellness strateay to connect children in care with Toquaht, new programs such as Family Zoom Night, various youth activities, one-on-one family supports, and welcoming tukwaa?ath babies.

Funding will also go towards implementing updated K-12 policies, general support for learners (tutoring, transit, technology needs, living allowance), implementing a new education and support policy, and early learning programs at Macoah (0-5 years of age).

To promote language and culture, there will be funding for the mindful addition of language and culture to all programming, culture kits for children, language resources for citizens and staff, land-based healing opportunities, and organizing quarterly language gatherings.

#### Lands, Public Works, and Resources

The total budget allocation for the Lands, Public Works, and Resources department for the 2023/2024 fiscal year is \$2,689,087.

#### \$948,908 of the budget is allocated towards lands, \$499,540 is allocated towards public works, and \$1,240,640 is allocated towards resources.

The lands budget will go include funding for the marine stewardship program, aquatic habitat restoration and official community plan (OCP) work.

The public works budget will go towards funding maintenance and management, inspections on citizen housing, improving internet connectivity, and the development of the public works yard.

The resources budget will fund the maximization of fish allocation, ongoing efforts to work with other Nations to trade and barter, and the organization of food gathering and processing activities for citizens.



#### **Elders Conference**

The 47th Annual Elders Gathering is on August 15 and 16, 2023. This event offers the opportunity for Elders to interface with youth chaperones and support workers, which helps to mitigate the generation gap, and allows the younger generations to demonstrate respect, regard, and honour for their Elders.

For the past 47 years(less 3 Covid-19 years), First Nations Elders have met in distinct locations of British Columbia. The first Elders Gathering began in Sto: Lo Nation hosted by the Coqualeeza Elders. Frances Harne carved a totem pole, which was used as a record keeper. Places and dates were inscribed at the base of the pole, recording each Gathering.

Elders Gatherings are a wonderful time for people to visit and exchange memories and knowledge, to create new friendships and to renew old ones. These gatherings provide a chance to gain perspective on how other First Nations live.

The basic purpose of the Gathering is the need for Elders throughout the province to have inter-social and community links that bind them together as a nation. It allows them to intermingle with like-minded, like-aged individuals and their families, to reveal common grounds that strengthen those links.

Our Elders possess all the wisdom of the ages knowledge and experiences that the younger generations need to guide them through life. It is very important that this event continues and that our Elders' legacy is passed on to each generation that follows. With the world we live in becoming increasingly modern by the minute, we need to provide the balance that comes from remembering the past through our Elders' lives.
