





What is GIS?


- Geographic Information Systems (GIS) is a collection of information from engineered drawings and field data collection



- We store the data that we collect and use it to show the condition that Toquaht's infrastructure is in using the GIS software.

Data Collection

- Data is collected using a pole-mounted GPS unit.
- Construction drawings are overlaid onto a map within the GIS.
- Collecting field data in Survey123




Inspecting Fire Hydrants

- Hydrants are inspected every six months
- The inspection consists of looking at the hydrant and flushing the hydrant
- The inspection gets recorded in a form in Survey 123.

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Where do we use GIS?

- 
- When we look at roads, sewer lines, water lines, culverts, etc. We use the GIS to record the condition that each part of your community is in.
 - We can then use that recorded information to both repair the parts that need to be, and plan for future repairs.



Lucky Creek Hydro


- Early in 2024, Toquaht received funding from the BC Indigenous Clean Energy Fund to advance the Run-of-the-River hydro development project to “construction ready.” This will position Toquaht to respond promptly to commercial renewable energy opportunities as they arise.
- Summit Power completed revisions to the Toquaht Hydro Project – Waterpower Development Plan (WDP). The amendment includes discussion around the Marbled Murrelet Wildlife Habitat Area in the upper Lucky Creek basin. The WDP, was submitted to BC for review with the intent of seeking approval of the plan and issuances of the necessary licenses and Right-of-Ways to move forward with the Hydro Project.
- Summit Power submitted an updated workplan and budget for the Advanced Site Layout and Detailed Investigation for Lower Lucky Creek. This work includes site surveys and investigations, design work, re-establishing data loggers, and the design and construction of a helipad. Work is expected to commence in the fall/winter 2024.

Secret Beach Marina

- In August, construction of the new marina parking lot was completed, and surrounding areas were seeded with grass. The parking lot, located on the high side of the road above the marina, was used by many marina visitors throughout the end of the busy summer season.





Macoah Water Reservoir

- The new water reservoir supplies Macoah and surrounding TSL. This includes providing Macoah with the water pressure and volume required for proper firefighting capacity.
- The project was substantially completed in August with the installation of electronic control upgrades including the PLC (programmable logic controller) and SCADA (supervisory control and data acquisition) systems. New chlorine injector pumps are also being sourced.
- A stream water flow monitor was installed at Macoah Creek to measure the flow of water. Water flowing over the dam will be monitored to predict long term supply availability. A biologist will also provide information on how much water is required to support fish navigating the creek.

New Government Building

- The conceptual design features 15,000 sq ft split between two levels. Including offices, shared work areas, meeting rooms, reception desk and lobby, boardrooms, kitchens, washrooms, and file and equipment storage rooms. The lower floor features space for several offices which can be finished in the future as the government expands.
- Toquaht's comments were incorporated into a revised design. Toquaht is currently reviewing the revised design.

qiyuus – 12-plex gathering place

- Construction of the qiyuus Lodge is now complete. It is in final stages of being furnished and will be available for full use soon.
- A landscape architect was engaged to complete a landscape design for this building and all other buildings in the immediate area. Rough grading around the building was completed in August. The final landscaping will be completed next fiscal year.

Macoah Playground and Outdoor Fitness Facility

- The facility was completed in late August and was greatly enjoyed by kids and adults during the Moveable Feast festival at Macoah.
- The playground includes a Treetop play structure with multiple slides, climbing apparatus, bridges, and play activities. A circular swing and bear-shaped spring rider are also included.
- The fitness facility features an elliptical, cardio stepper, chest/back press, ab crunch/leg lift, squat press, and pullup/dip bars.
- Toquaht Red and Black were chosen for the colour scheme with blue and green accents on the playground.
- An accessible trail was also completed which leads from the playground to the beach.

Secret Beach Playground and Outdoor Fitness Facility

- The Secret Beach Playground and Fitness Facility was completed and opened to campers and marina guests prior to the Labour Day long weekend.
- The playground features an accessible Supernetplex Tower, Crab Trap multi-use adventure climber, a circular swing, accessible spinner, and a 50ft zipline.
- The fitness facility features a squat press, pullup/dip bars, ab crunch/leg lift, tai chi wheels, and assisted row/push up bars.
- Toquaht Red and Black were chosen for the colour scheme along with lagoon blue accents.



Old Campground Contaminated Site

- Toquaht will continue the comprehensive review of the Draft Remediation Action Plan (RAP) being developed by BC. This document will form the basis for the remediation Detailed Design.
- BC will release a Request for Proposals (RFP) to qualified engineering firms to complete the detailed remediation design. Toquaht will have an opportunity to review and comment on this design at every stage in its development.




Macoah Public Washroom

- The facility will offer four (4) bathroom stalls including two (2) with showers.
- The building will be constructed using Insulated Concrete Forms (ICF) which have been used successfully for other Toquaht projects including the 12-plex.
- Construction is expected to be completed before the end of the current fiscal year.



Section 38 subdivision

- Design concept options for this new housing development above Macoah will be presented to the Executive for consideration. Progressive design features will be incorporated so that the area does not look like a typical subdivision.
- The objectives of the 24/25 fiscal year are to complete detailed design reviews, take the design to 100%, and then pursue various funding opportunities in support of the construction phase of this project. There is no construction planned for the 24/25 fiscal year.

Secret Beach Offsite Services

- The work to install the offsite sewer and water lines from Macoah to Secret Beach is now completed. The sanitary pump chamber construction is also completed.
- The work to install the new BC Hydro line from Macoah to Secret Beach continues. This section of the line should be completed this fall.
- A design is now complete to extend the sewer and water service lines, down the Maggie Road, from the sani dump to the Marina. A design is also underway to extend the BC Hydro powerlines from the Marina to the Log Sort.
- Clearing of the hydro Right-of-Way to extend power from the Secret Beach Marina to the Log Sort began in this fall. Tree felling has been put on hold until after the bird nesting season.
- The rock from the BC Hydro Right-of-Way blasting will be utilized to construct the new marina parking area.

Secret Beach Developments



- Phase 1 sanitary sewer, water and storm water underground piping is now complete. The underground services for Phase 1 are now complete.
- The objectives of the 24/25 fiscal year are to complete Phase 1 hydro service (35 lots), construct Phase 2 (41 lots), and pave both Phases at the same time in spring 2025.

Kayak Launch


- The Kayak launch parking lot construction began earlier in the quarter and is ready for use while finishing touches are applied.

Washroom & Shower House

- A washroom and shower house will be constructed at the Kayak Launch using the same design as the Macoah washroom and shower house. Groundwork is underway.

Footbridges

- Revisions on the Structural Designs for the three footbridges are underway.
- Work is underway to identify potential funding opportunities to assist with the construction of the three bridges.


